Laura Harrill began as a CFC volunteer with St Andrews Church and since 2008, has been writing grant requests for CFC. She research-

es potential grants on the internet, visits with store or agency employees to learn about grant opportunities and identifies grants whose missions mesh with ours. She also works closely with United Way for federal grants. Some grants are one-time, but she says " once we get money from an organization, it's often easier to get other grants" and CFC has received a grant from Food Lion Charitable Foundation for 14 years. She will be retiring in January and has been working closely with Board member Gaines Lee who will continue writing grants. Sheri and Russell Liles have been organic farming for over 25 years. During COVID, Farmers Markets closed and they could no longer sell their organic grown vegetables. Talking with folks at church, they decided to utilize their 15-20 beds to raise food to donate to the community. 30 Master gardeners working in 4-6 person teams from March – November prep and plant the beds, maintain, water and harvest the crops throughout the season. In 2023, 2,130 pounds of broccoli, cauliflower, peppers, cabbage, asparagus, radishes, carrots, green onions, kale, green beans, zucchini, potatoes, and garlic were donated to CFC and New Providence.



Over 400 pounds of fresh vegetables have been donated this year. Thank you Russell, Sherri and all the Master Gardeners for this wonderful ministry!
