A Record Year

In 2025, we served 50,630 clients, of whom 25% were children and 22% were senior citizens.

- Our volunteers contributed over 15,000 hours.
- We received in-kind donations of food and other items from individuals, churches, and businesses valued at \$304,597, in addition to a record amount of cash donations.
- We spent \$137,500 purchasing food to keep our shelves full.
